The Divine Feminine Inside You

She is personified in the Orient as Quanyin. Eastern Indians know her as Parvati or Sita or Saraswati. And let's not forget the Virgin Mary, the Egyptian goddess Isis, the Greek goddess Aphrodite, or the spider woman of the North American Indians. Her names and forms go on and on, across the globe and throughout history. It is nothing new, this notion of the divine feminine as a paramount force our lives. Aphrodite came out of the sea, and is thus associated with its life-giving powers. She had immense influence in the divine realm, yet her purpose was simple: to bring love and beauty into the world. Despite her many affairs with both mortals and gods, she represents more than just physical intimacy. The overwhelming force of love is her true message to the world.

Saraswati is about learning, language, music and enlightenment. She originated as a river goddess, again symbolising the creative power of the earth. The white lotus on which she is often seated represents the search for cosmic knowledge. In many portraits there is a peacock depicted at her feet, symbolising the subjugation of pride through knowledge and beauty.



Known as the embodiment of mercy and compassion, Quanyin has many names throughout Asia. She is sometimes depicted as androgynous or even male, indicating the oneness of all things. But her usual form is that of a radiant goddess who is willing to sacrifice everything for the benefit of others. This selfless desire to relieve suffering is associated with the highest vibrations of feminine energy.

Spider Grandmother, a deity in several American Indian tribes, is a creator goddess who brought the world into existence by dreaming. Changing Woman is another important goddess from this culture. She can transform from an old woman to a young girl at will, and thus represents the transformative power of nature. Changing Woman teaches people how to live in harmony.



There are thousands of examples—but from these four alone, the characteristics of the divine feminine are obvious. Compassion, creativity, beauty, power. There are also many wrathful goddesses, such as the Indian goddess Kali, but her wrath is always purposeful, to restore balance. At the heart of every goddess is a compassionate, gentle, yet immense power that is based in cooperation and harmony. In a word, love. . .

As with all divine energy, the true home of the goddess is within nature—and within each one of us. Besides bringing about a better world, awakening the divine feminine within is a powerful way to manifest abundance and beauty in your own life. All it takes is a little focus and intention. Here is an easy way to get started:

Create a small altar to the goddess. It doesn't have to be anything special, just a dedicated space. You can dedicate it a particular goddess, or simply to the divine feminine. Burn some incense, oil or candles in her honour as you close your eyes and begin to visualise her, focusing on the radiant details. Incense for Manifestation

Whether it's a new car, a lover, or anything else you can think of, incense can help you get the results you're looking for.

The practice of manifestation often takes the form of meditation, mantras, and visualisation. Its power lies in the hidden abilities of the mind to create outcomes within the physical universe. This is also known as the **law of attraction**.

Incense is a powerful and readily available tool for boosting your manifestations. Our sense of smell is perhaps the most potent of all the senses. A particular aroma can **trigger** distant memories as if they occurred yesterday, and return us to particular states of mind. Logically, by using the same incense each time for a particular manifestation, you create a **psychic link** between a that aroma and the thoughts you cultivate in your manifestation practice. For example, if you are trying to manifest better finances, and you burn patchouli each time you practice this manifestation, you will create a subconscious trigger that puts you in the mindset of achieving greater wealth every time you catch the scent of patchouli.

As the manifestor, you must **experiment** to find out which aromas work best for you and your goals. You can also lean on tradition. Over thousands of years, cultures around the world have ascertained certain uses for certain fragrances. By combining this knowledge with your own experimentation, you can find the fragrances that are best suited to your desires and goals.

As well as a variety of scents, incense comes in different forms. The most common is the **stick**, which consists of a wooden stick coated in resin. **Spiral** incense is similar, but is coiled and burns longer. **Cone** incense gradually emits a stronger aroma as it burns down. These different forms can be worked into your manifestations. For instance, cone incense works well for manifesting long-term goals, while sticks go well with more immediate desires.

When you have your incense and are ready to begin, take a moment to clear

your mind before lighting. Once lit, take a few moments to breathe the fragrance and focus on its subtleties. Then begin your manifestation practice.

When manifesting, it is possible to ask the universe for anything you desire. For some, this might be a better paid job or a bigger house. Others might wish to find their soul mate or improve an existing relationship. You may be seeking to boost your spiritual growth or cleanse your body and mind of negative energy. All of these are valid uses of manifestation. It takes practice and patience, but incense taps the mysterious **power of aromas** to support your desires and enhance the process of manifestation.

Finally, don't make it a one-off thing! Repeat this practice often to reinforce and strengthen your desires. If possible, burn incense every day to keep specific goals at the forefront of your conscious and subconscious mind. Then, trust in the universe to deliver!
